Warther Museum Opens Original Warther Home And Finds Hidden Treasure

Workers at the Warther Museum recently found the oldest known creation of world famed carver, Ernest "Mooney" Warther. Mark Warther, grandson of the carver and curator of the museum, stated that "while preparing the Warther home for its grand opening and repairing spouting, workers found sitting on a rafter, in the roof of the house, a walnut and hickory steam engine. Based on material and craftsmanship I believe the train was carved in 1905. How it got there we are not sure, but it was sitting in a spot sealed off from the inside of the house. Magazines from the Great Depression were also found with it, so we believe it has been there for 80 years".

Mark Warther said, "He destroyed most of his early carvings because he didn't feel they were good enough. The locomotive found is certainly not the quality of the works in the museum, but it shows my grandfather's progression from when he first started until he was on a level of world class art". This summer, the Warther Museum, will expand its tour to include the original home of the Warther's and will proudly display this newest addition of the Warther collection on the mantel.

Mooney Warther was born Oct. 30, 1885 and lived in Dover, Ohio his entire life. He originally gained notoriety for his impeccable kitchen knives. He is most famous, however, for his train carvings of walnut, ebony and ivory, including the "Lincoln Funeral Train" and the "Empire State Express". The "Empire" is an eight foot long ivory train consisting of 11,000 parts in which many are moving. He quickly gained fame for his work, but turned down offers from The New York Central Railroad and Henry Ford, alike, to return to his hometown and devote himself entirely to carving, knife making, and family.

Mooney's wife Frieda was an artist in her own right. Collecting thousands of buttons for more than 70 years, she created her own original designs and layouts with her findings. Her button house, filled with her work, still sits among the Warther's Swiss-style gardens today and is a pivotal part of the

museum tour.

The newly renovated home served as the original museum, with guests invited right into the Warther family living room until 1936, when everything was moved to the present Button House. An even larger museum was built in 1963 and expanded in 2002 to the 50,000 square foot facility that exists today. A guided tour progresses through the lives of the Warther's, beginning in their home, venturing through the Button House, Swiss gardens, original workshop, and finally into the state-of-the-art galleries which showcase all of Mooney's creations. Of course, a stop in the knife and gift shop is inevitable, as it serves as the only place to purchase original Warther family kitchen cutlery and memorabilia.

In the end, it is difficult to describe the unbelievable artistic genius of both Mooney and Frieda Warther, but, with the opening of their home, it will be easy to see that for these two special individuals, family came first. The museum tour will now illustrate exactly how the Warthers lived, showcasing the incredible talent that came out of a small town in rural Ohio. Experience the story first hand this summer by visiting the Warther Museum and witness how one man became "The World's Master Carver."

5 Minute Candy Bar Pie

- 1 1/4 C. cold milk
- 2 (3.9 oz.) packages JELL-O Chocolate Flavor or Vanilla Flavor Instant Pudding & Pie Filling Mix
- 1 (8 oz.) tub COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed, divided
- 4 (1.5 oz.) bars chocolate candy, cut into 1/4-inch pieces, divided
- 1 ready-to-use chocolate flavor crumb crust (6 oz. or 9 in.)

Beat milk, pudding mixes and 1/2 of the whipped topping in medium bowl with wire whisk 1 minute. (Mixture will be thick.) Reserve 1/4 C. of the candy bar pieces; stir remaining pieces into pudding mixture. Spoon into crust. Spread remaining whipped topping over pudding mixture; sprinkle with remaining candy pieces. Serve immediately or refrigerate until ready to serve.

From The Pastor's Desk

"Hold Fast Your Confidence"

Holding fast to your confidence is based upon God's Word (the Bible). By not casting it away and by putting our patience (means endurance) to work, we receive the promise (the reward). Heb. 10:35 The Bible says...*Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompense of reward.* Vs. 36... *For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise.* That's why it's so important to study your Bible every day and build scriptures in your heart, pertaining to what you're believing God for. Quoting scriptures and praising Him for the victory that's yours. When you do this it will keep you away from wavering (being double minded). For the Law of Faith is, no wavering. It's being single minded. NOTE: Matt. 6:22 says...*The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light.* Meaning this: Only seeing and hearing the Word of God and what it says. Putting the Word of God in control of your life. God has left us precious promises to live by.

II Peter 1:3...*According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue:* Vs. 4...*Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.* He has given these precious promises to live by. There are promises pertaining to eter-

Isa. 1:19...*If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land:* Vs. 20 says...*But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured with the sword: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it.* Matt 6:33...*But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.* I Peter 2:24...*Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.*

NOTE: Three things here; 1. Be willing and obedient. 2. Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness (God, His ways, and His way of life). 3. Be dead to sins and live unto righteousness. When we know ours lives are right with God, and we are living right, then we have confidence in God. NOTE: I John 3:21-22...*Beloved, if our heart condemn us not, then have we confidence toward God.* Vs 22...*And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight.*

We have an assurance through God's Word that we can receive our prayers answered, if we live according to God's Word.
